
COVID-19: INFORMATION ABOUT SYMPTOMS, TESTING, AND ISOLATING

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature, but if you do, the temperature considered to be a fever is 37.8°C).
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours. It is usually a dry cough, with no mucous. (If you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

What to do if you, or someone in your household, has symptoms or tests positive.
