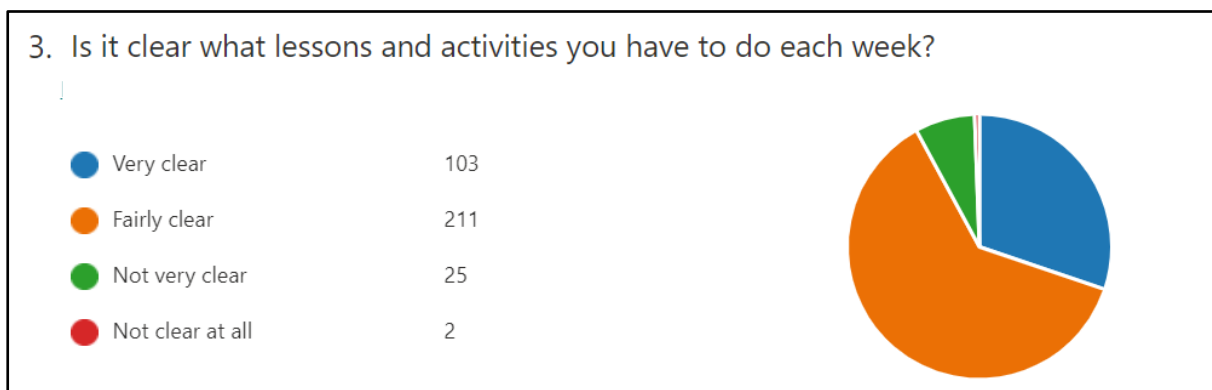
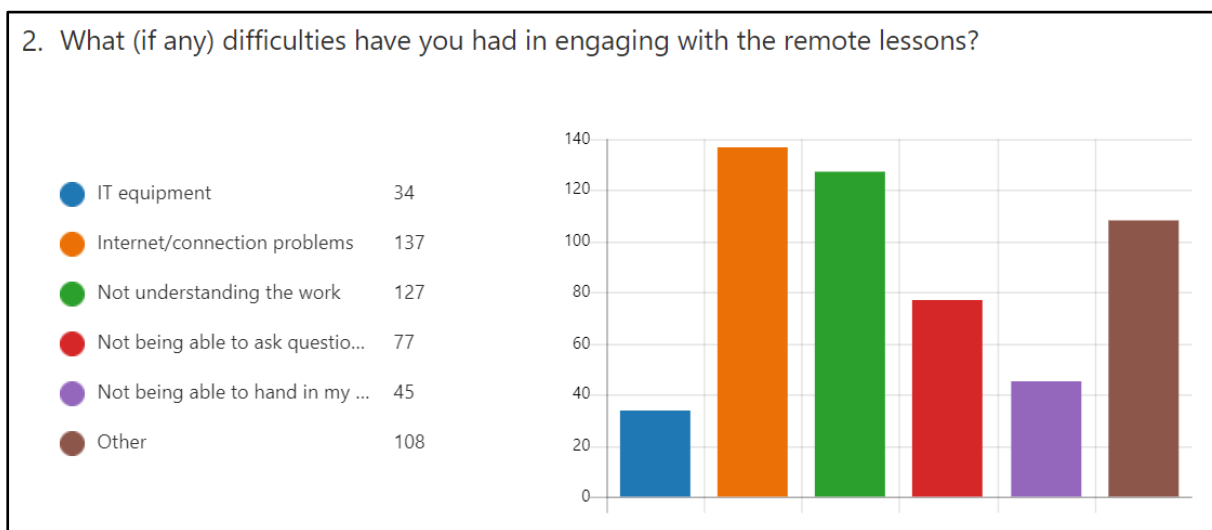
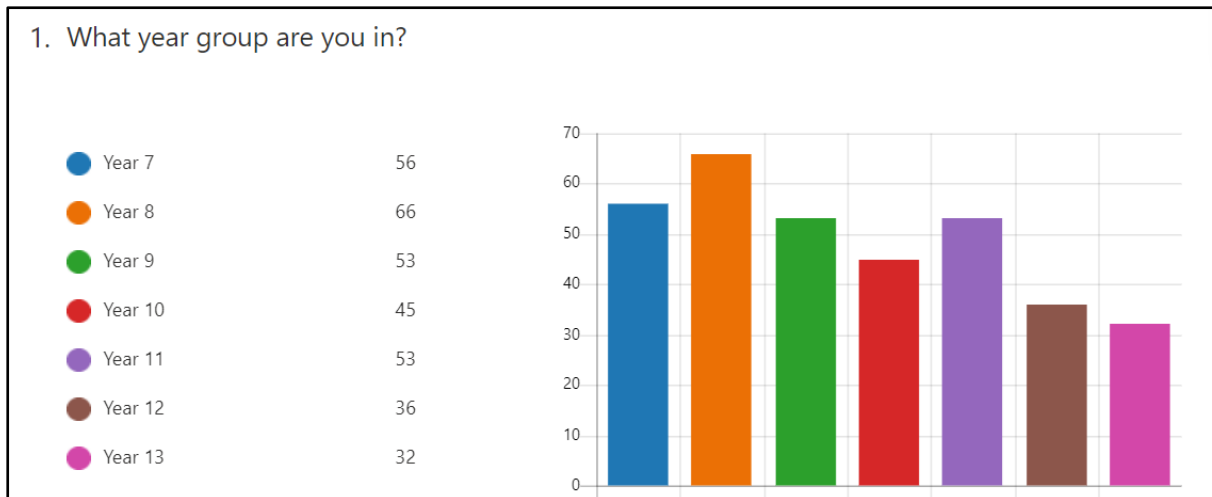


## Remote Learning Survey - Students

- Not very clear in any lessons 3



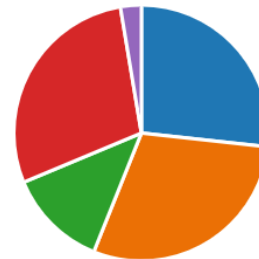
#### 5. Do you feel you are learning well?

- Other 18



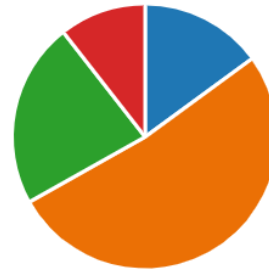
#### 7. Overall, how do you find remote learning?

Based on responses to the last 2 questions we have produced answers to the following frequently asked questions:

- Can teachers give clearer instructions in lessons?

*Teachers always do their best to give clear instructions in lessons. This is much more difficult in an online lesson so we strongly encourage students to ask for help and to speak up if you do not understand a task. This can be done by speaking or using the chat feature in Microsoft Teams.*

- Can we be give longer to complete some tasks in lessons and to answer questions?

*We will pass this feedback to teachers but being able to judge when students have completed tasks is much more difficult in an online lesson. We would encourage you to speak up or use the chat feature if they need more time in a lesson.*

- Can lessons be shorter? Can there be more breaks in lessons? Can lunch and break be longer?

*Lessons will continue to be the same length, but we will ask teachers to give additional time at the end of the lesson for saving and submitting work. Teachers have already been asked to provide a break in each lesson and we will remind them of the importance of this. We strongly encourage you to take this time to have a break from your screens and to try and move around during these breaks.*

- Can there be no homework set?

Teachers have been asked not to set homework for students in years 7 to 11. Work will still be set for students in years 12 and 13 to complete during independent study time.

- Can more feedback on work be given?

*Teachers are giving feedback in line with the school's policy. We appreciate that students are missing out on the verbal informal feedback which is normally given during lessons. We would encourage you to ask for this type of feedback if there is the opportunity during online lessons and to submit all work that is asked for.*
