

Key Stage 5 (Years 12 and 13) Reports

How many reports will there be?

In year 13, there will be 2 reports – Autumn and Spring terms.

In year 12, there will be 3 reports – one each term

What information will the report include?

The top of the report will include:

Attendance figures – since the start of September

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How do the Grades work?

Most subjects use A Level A* to E grades. These may also include a + or – sub grade.

Health and Social Care use vocational grades which use distinction *, distinction, merit and pass.

Target grades are minimum targets for the end of the course.

For each term, a working at grade will be awarded by the teacher.

How does Attitude to Learning (ATL) work?

Grade descriptors for Attitude to Learning are as follows:

4 - Outstanding

Always displays excellent motivation for learning and a thirst for knowledge. Leads learning in the classroom and beyond. Perseveres when presented with a challenge. Learns from advice and self-reflection. Takes pride in presentation and proof reads for accuracy.

Homework is always completed with extra learning and attention to detail.

3 - Good

Often displays good motivation for learning and a thirst for knowledge. Perseveres when presented with a challenge and takes pride in most aspects of work.

Homework is always completed on time with good attention to detail.

2 – Requires Improvement

Displays limited enthusiasm and motivation for learning and is inconsistent in some aspects.

Homework is usually completed but not to the highest standards achievable.

1 - Unacceptable

Displays little commitment to learning. Needs to take action to achieve the expected standard for A Level study.

Homework is regularly incomplete.
