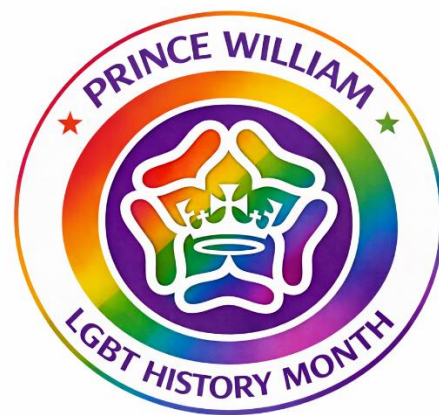

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Homework Club

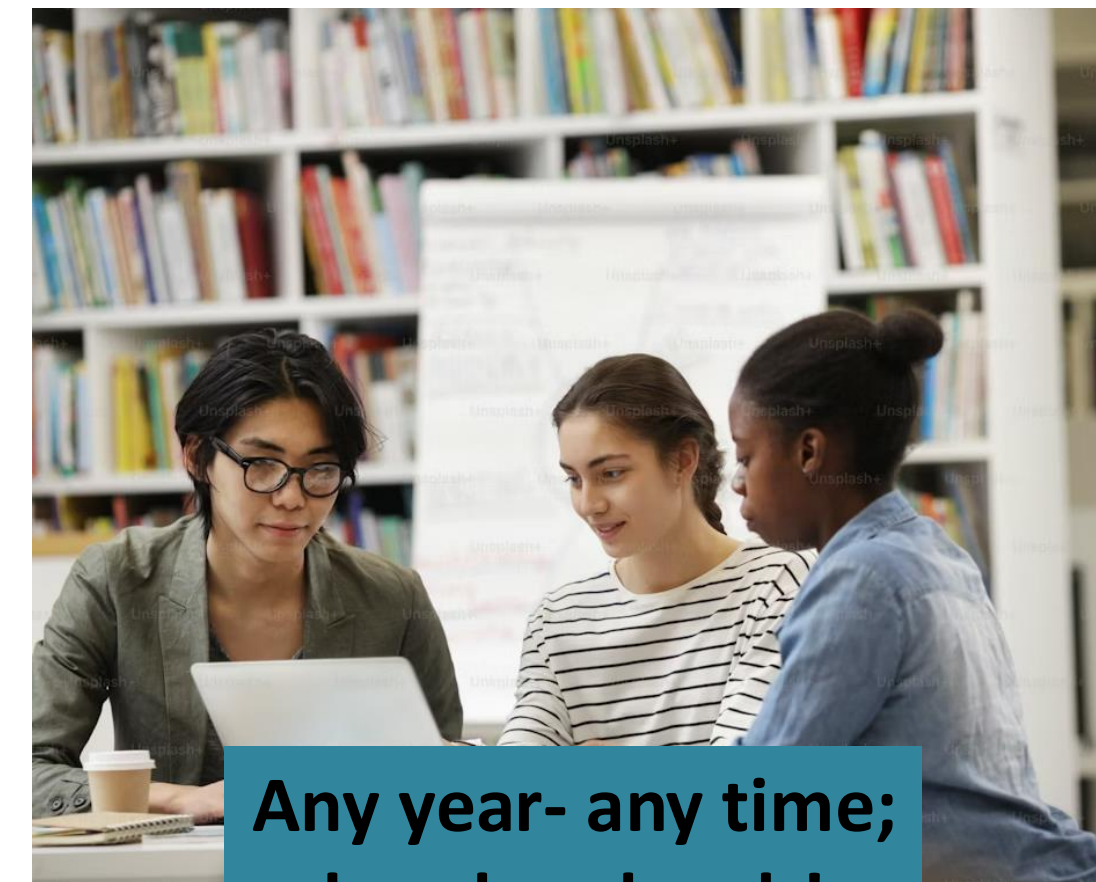
Do you have work that you would prefer to do in school, rather than when you get home and just want to relax?

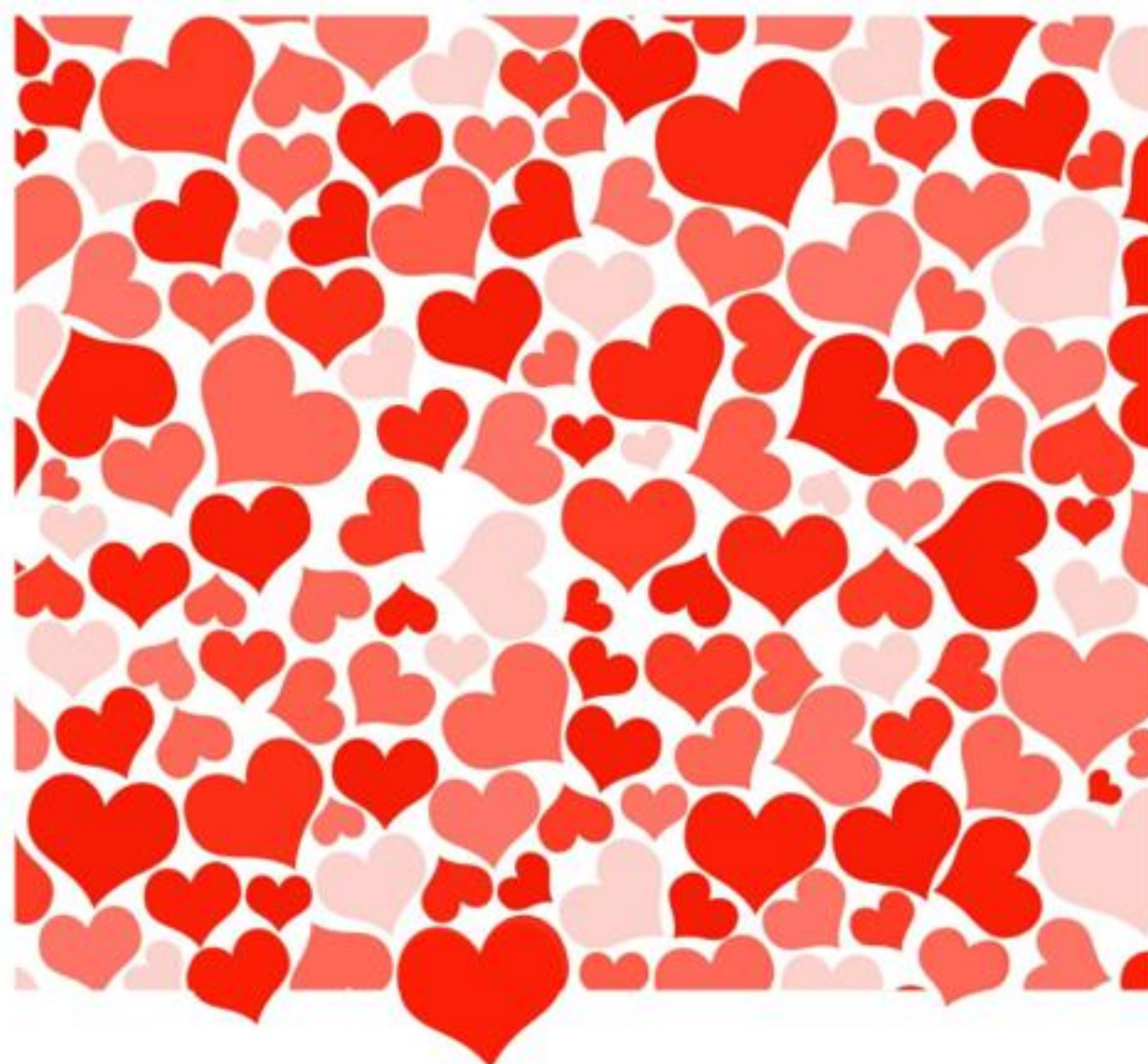

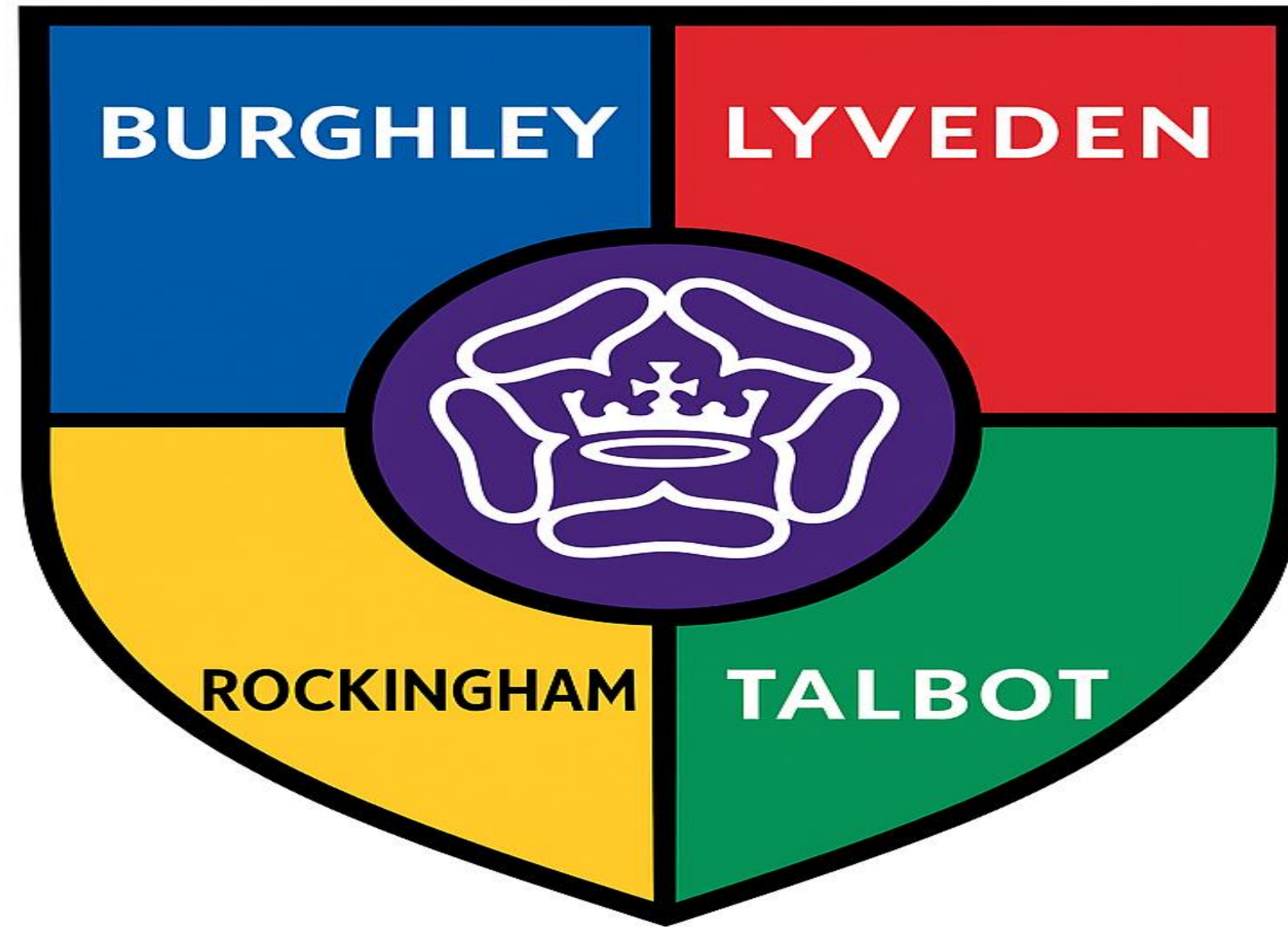

Eco Challenge Update – Quiz Scores

We had 31 forms complete the eco challenge quiz in Week 1 and the results were as follows:

Year 7 – 1st Rockingham – 32 points. 2nd = Lyveden – 25 points. 2nd = Talbot – 25 points. 4th Burghley - 14 points.

Year 8 – 1st Talbot – 27 points. 2nd Rockingham – 26 points. 3rd Burghley – 25 points. 4th Lyveden – 15 points.

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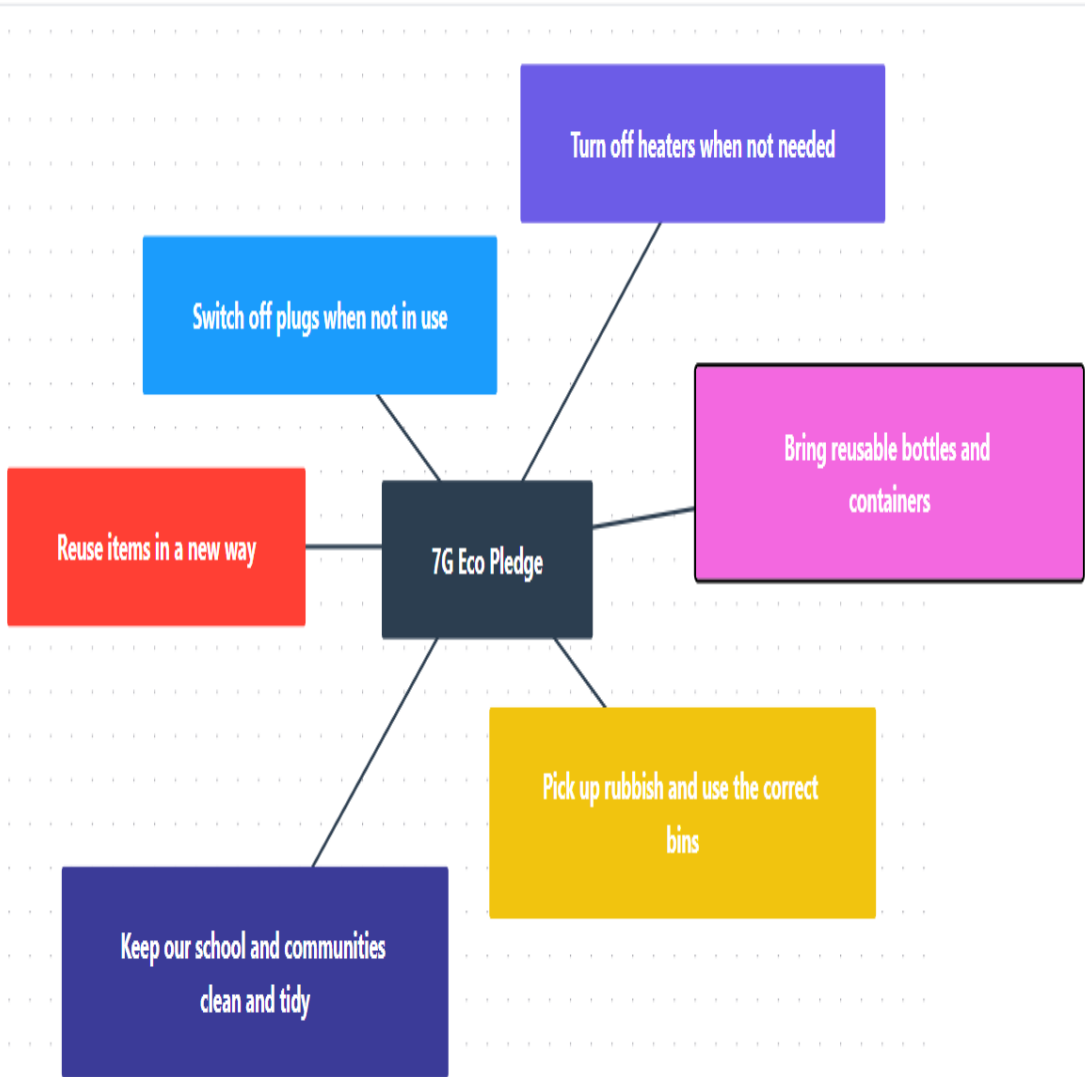
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Eco Challenge Pledges – Year 7

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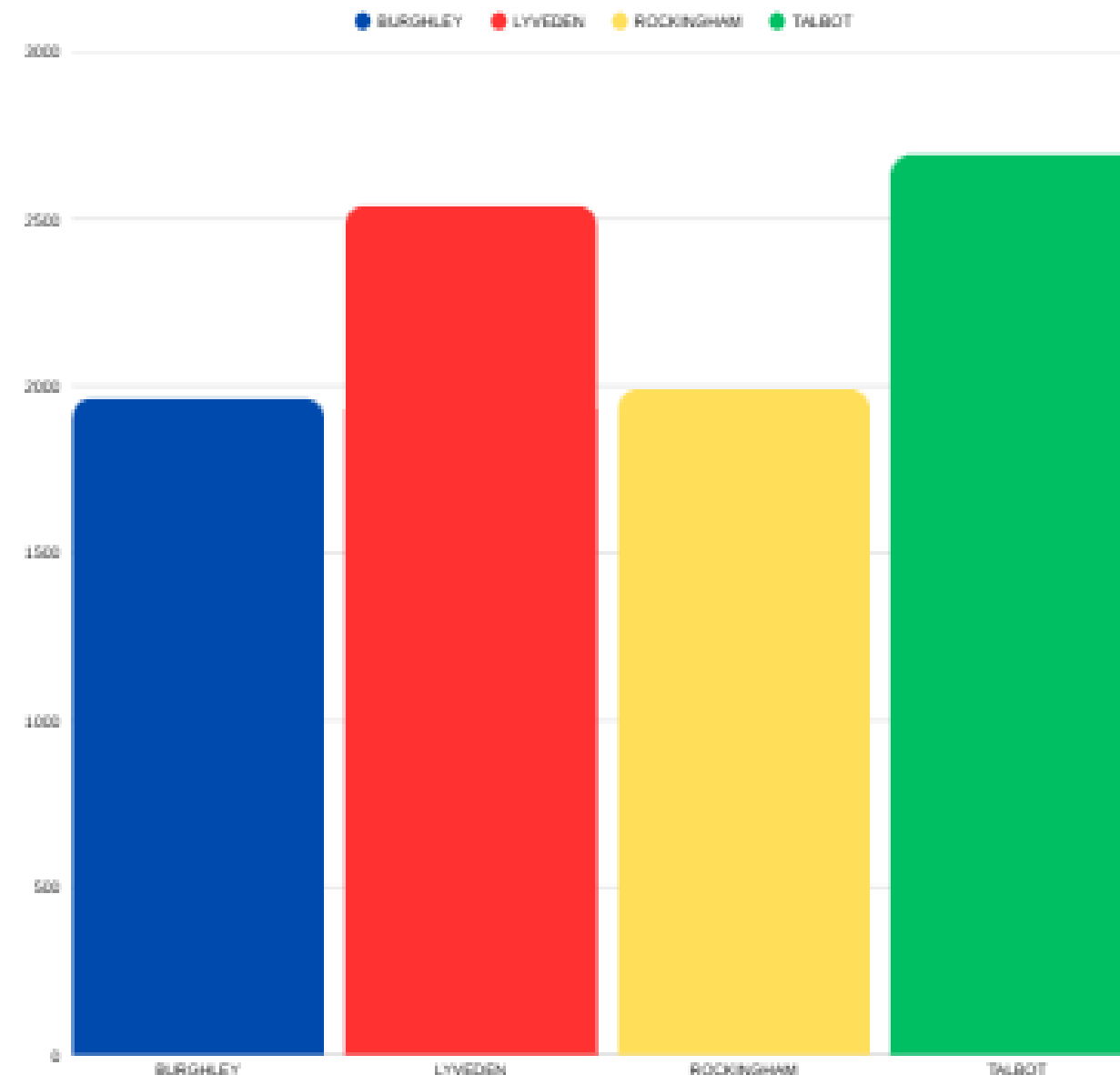
