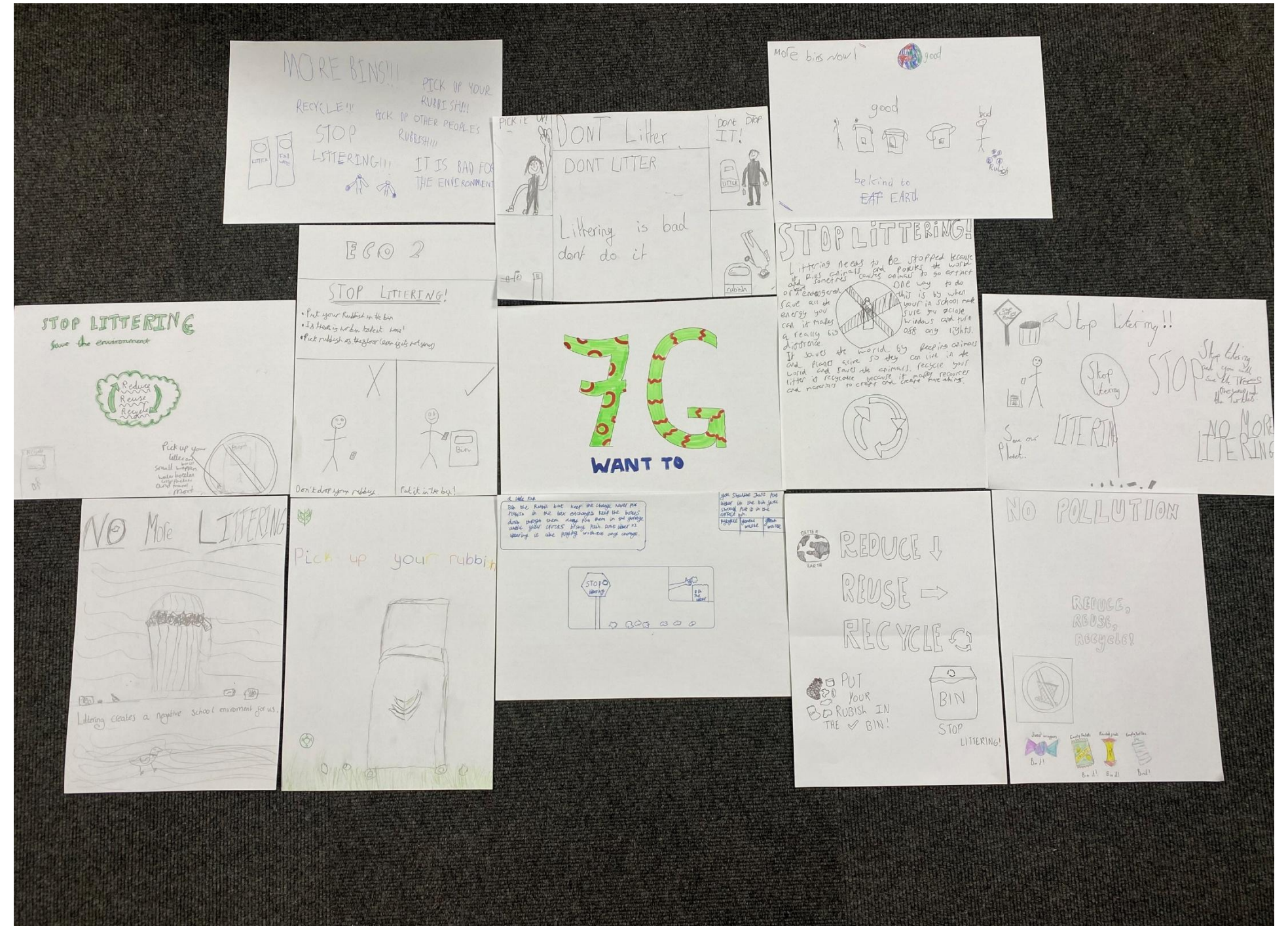


Week 2 - Eco Challenge Update – Eco Advocacy

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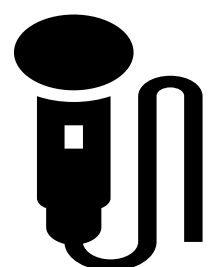
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How to sign up for the TALENT SHOW
