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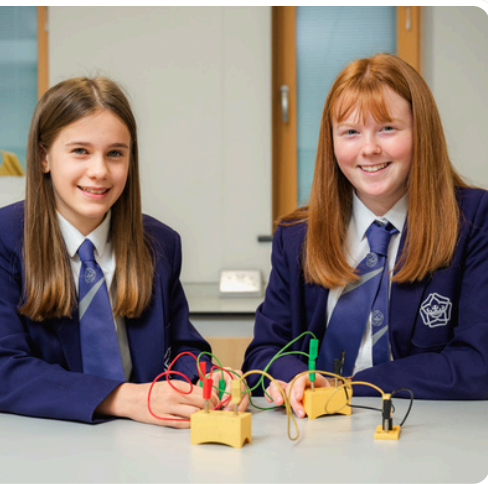


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Our curriculum

The curriculum at Prince William School focuses on the qualities and skills that learners need in order to be successful in school and beyond in later life.

The school currently follows a three-year Key Stage 3 model with students choosing their option subjects at the end of Year 9. This is then followed by a two-year Key Stage 4 and a two-year Key Stage 5 programme of study where students currently have a free option choice for their GCSE and A level courses.



All students follow a broad and balanced curriculum throughout their KS3 programmes of study. The curriculum offered at KS3 builds upon the knowledge, understanding and skills taught at primary school and prepares them for a range of courses at KS4.

The timetable is based on a 30-period 2-week cycle with each period being 100-minutes in length.

Wellbeing is at the heart of what we do in order to ensure that our students are successful in their learning and that they have the support they need to build sustainable coping skills to thrive throughout life. Our excellent provision supports students in crisis and implements interventions to help young people to improve their mental health. We have staff in our pastoral area that have been trained as mental health first aiders and work closely with families to support our students.
