

Courses students have to do at KS4

Prince William School follows the National Curriculum as laid down by Government. This covers the subjects which the Government states are the entitlement of every child and forms the compulsory core subjects.



Combined Science and Triple Science

All students will study at least 'Combined Science' which covers aspects of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. They get two GCSE grades for this.

The students in the top two or three sets will study 'Triple Science' which results in 3 GCSEs: one in Biology, one in Chemistry, and one in Physics. Three separate grades.

This allows all students to choose four additional subjects so that those doing Triple Science attain an extra GCSE and do not have to sacrifice one of their options in order to do Triple Science.

Types of qualifications

- GCSE : level 2 course taken over 2 years mainly exams at the end of the course in Year 11
- BTEC or other vocational: level 2 course taken over 2 years mainly non-examined assessment (NEA)
- We recommend no more than 2 of these because of the 'in year' workload of NEAs)
- Both progress to level 3 courses post-16, and higher education opportunities post-18.



We cannot guarantee you will get the subjects you choose

- ▶ If numbers are too small some courses may not run
- If numbers are too big we may have to ask some students to choose a different subject
- Free choice enables a larger majority to get their preferred subject combination, but...
- If your choices don't fit with the columns created by the majority, you will be asked to choose a different subject
- It is crucial you put down a reserve choice and be willing to take that subject.

- You like your present teacher


Good reasons for choosing a subject
